Taking part in exhibitions is an essential customer engagement exercise which allows the AMEC to showcase new technologies and reach new audiences.

This year we took part in a number of high profile exhibitions, working closely with our industrial partners which maximised our opportunities to talk directly with our external stakeholders.

Offshore Europe Exhibition 2007, Aberdeen, UK

This year, AMEC celebrated 35 years of operating in the oil and gas industry, dating from the Shell Auk project in the UK Central North Sea in the 1970s. At Offshore Europe we displayed our long-term experience in asset development and asset support, and some of our technology partners gave demonstrations on how we are applying the latest specialist techniques in oil and gas.

SE Asia Exhibition 2007

AMEC also took part in the 11th Oil and Gas Asia Exhibition, held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre. An estimated 800 exhibitors, ranging from national and international oil and gas companies, contractors and suppliers showcased their technologies, goods and services over the three days which attracted over 10,000 trade visitors from 45 countries including China, Indonesia, Thailand, UK and the US.

This year AMEC Malaysia co-exhibited with local partners, MMC Oil and Gas, showing the progress AMEC (Malaysia) has made in local connections over the past two years and provided AMEC the opportunity to raise local and international awareness of our

ambition for convergence and in development of AMEC's 3rd global engineering hub, hence making Malaysia a centre for global value creation and technical competency.

The stand attracted a large number of visitors which gave both companies an excellent opportunity to meet with many clients and other interested visitors. Oil and Gas Asia is a biannual event and is one of the largest of its kind, and is held in conjunction with the Petronas Conference and the Annual Asia Oil and Gas Conference.

International Oil & Gas Exhibition 2007

The snow capped peaks of the Tien Shan mountains provided a stunning background to the largest exhibition in Central Asia – the 15th Kazakhstan International Oil & Gas Exhibition (KIOGE 2007) which was held at the Atakent Exhibition Centre in Almaty between 2-5 October.

AMEC was among the 660 companies from 33 different countries represented at KIOGE. Our various businesses in Kazakhstan – AMEC Natural Resources' engineering office in Uralsk, AMEC BKKS in Aksai, Mapel in Atyrau, and also Earth & Environmental and Mining & Metals – were featured both on our exhibition stand and also in a brochure – 'AMEC in Kazakhstan'. All the material was written in three languages: English, Kazakh and Russian.

AMEC's stand was well located near key customers such as The BG Group and Karachaganak

Petroleum Organisation. Visitors ranged from eminent personalities as the Minister of Energy and Mineral Resources for the Republic of Kazakhstan, the British Ambassador to Kazakhstan and His Royal Highness the Duke of York to engineering undergraduates from the local universities.
