In October 2007 Neil agreed to become a trustee of Engineers Against Poverty (EAP) charity. EAP works with industry, government and civil society to fight poverty and promote sustainable development. They influence corporate and public policy and help develop practical solutions aimed at creating jobs, promoting enterprise development and improving education and training.
